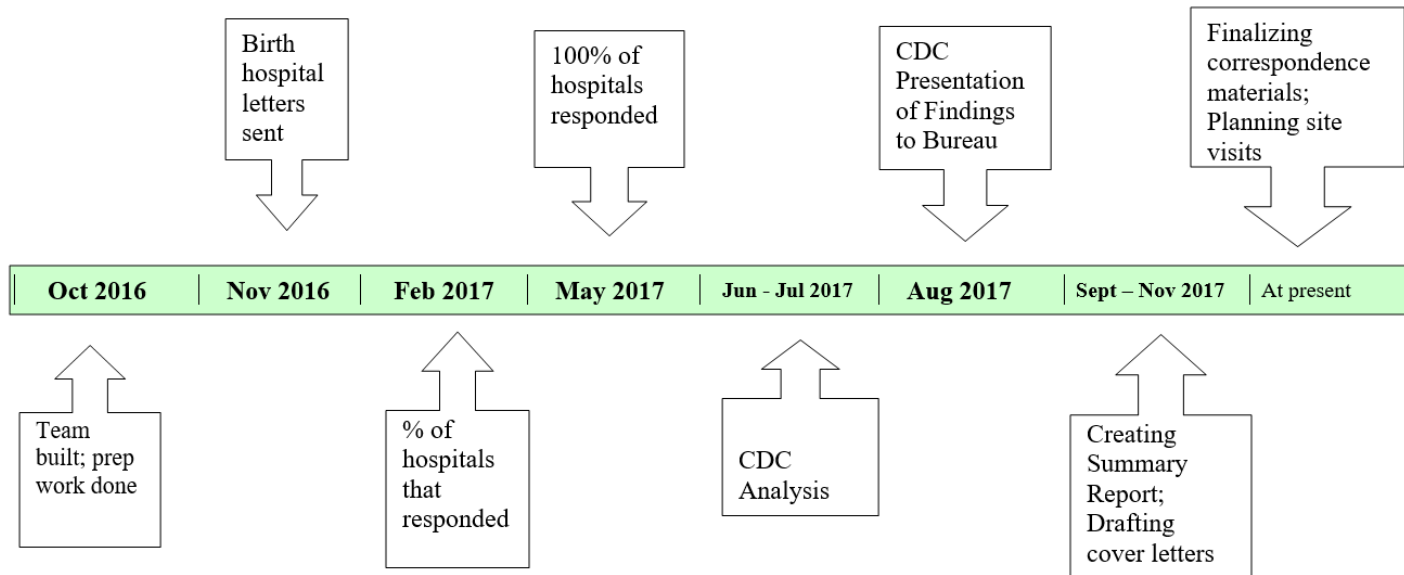

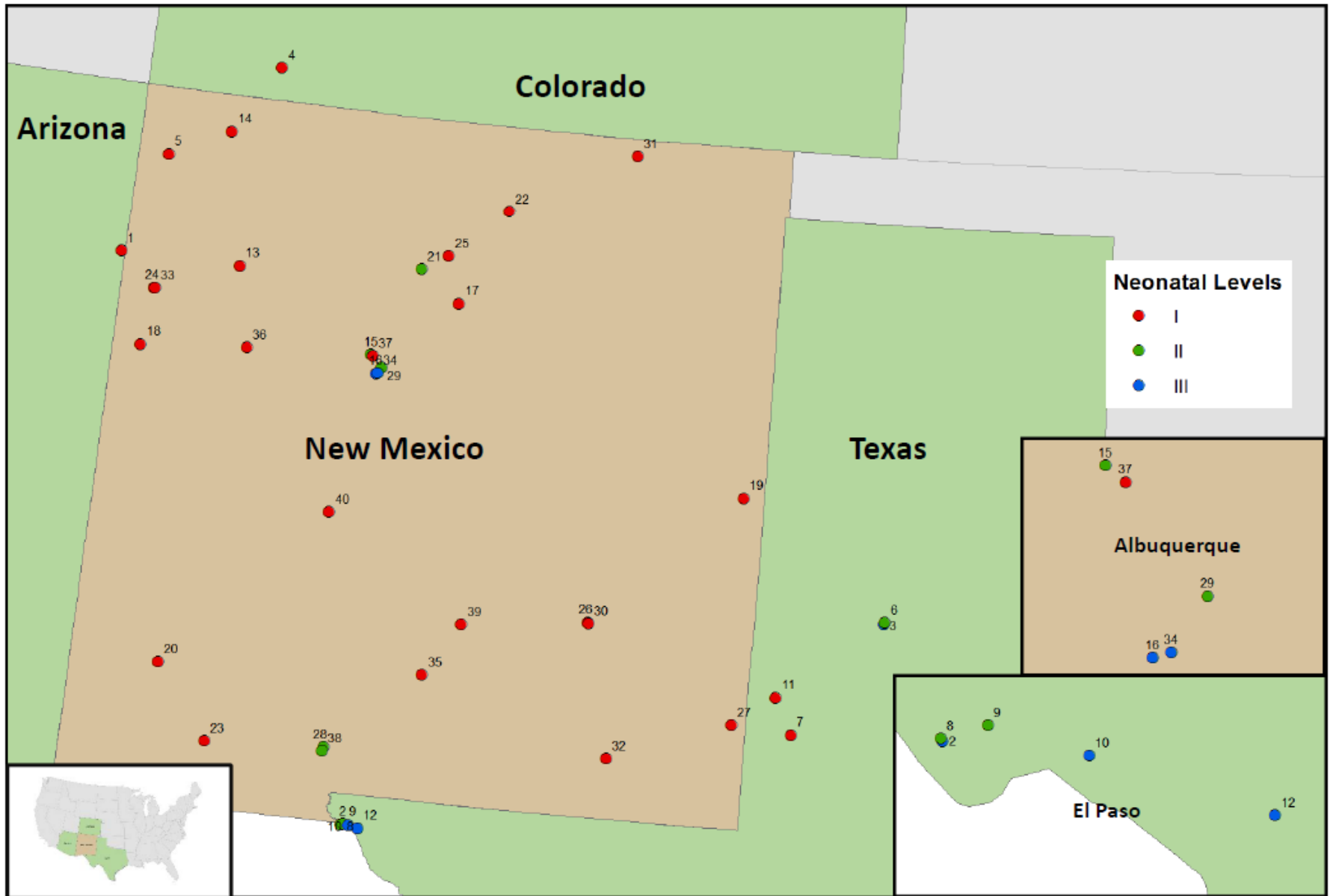
NM LOCATe Timeline



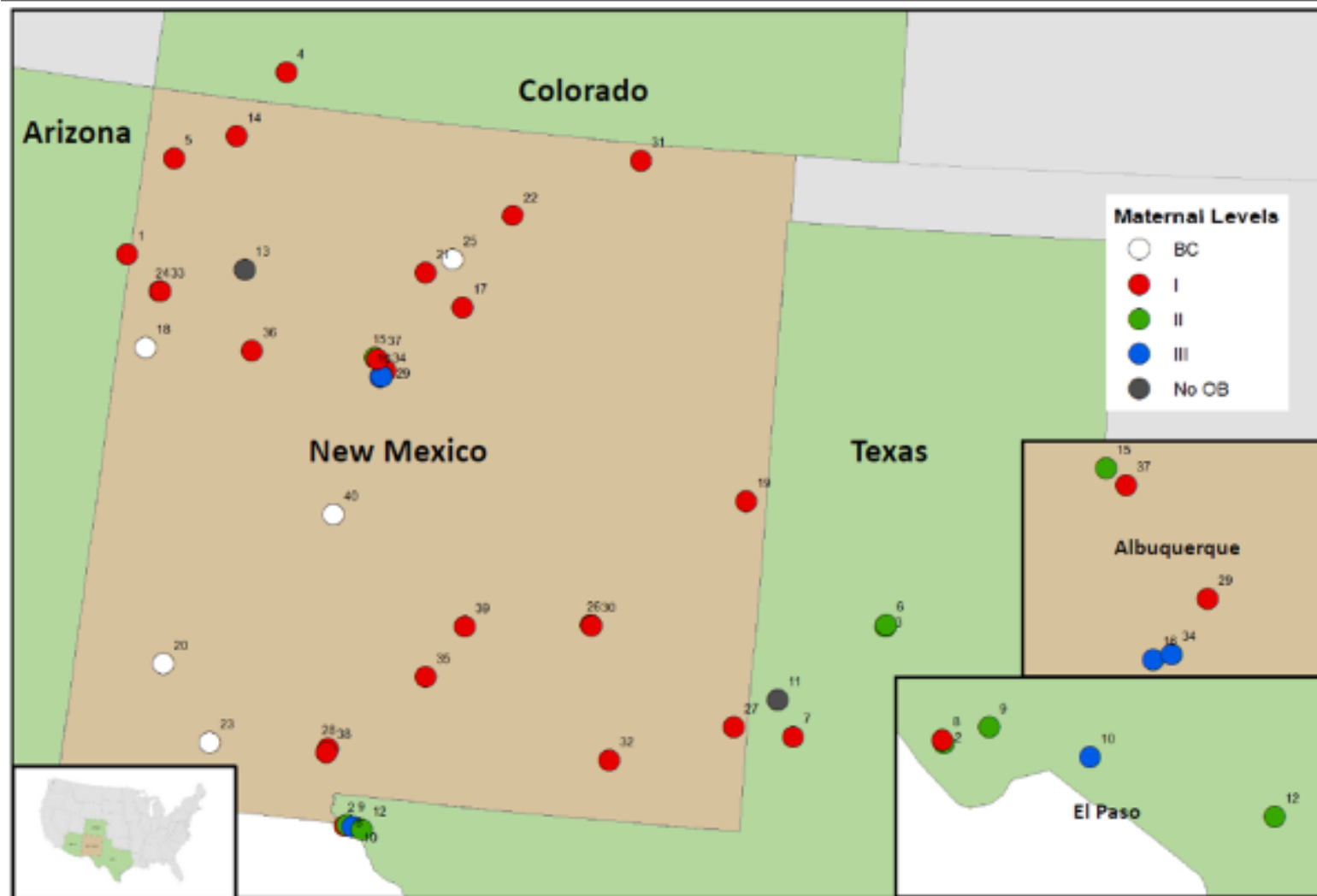
NM LOCATe Project Timeline/Notes

- Twenty nine birth hospitals located in state;
 - 9 hospitals in Texas
 - 1 hospital in CO
 - 1 hospital in AZ
 - Total hospitals responding = 40
- Site visits planned for spring 2018 with NMDOH Health Officer (neonatology- trained)
